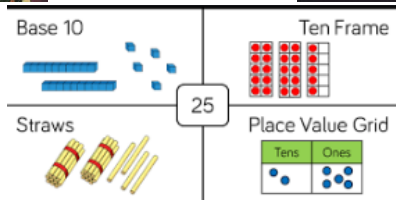
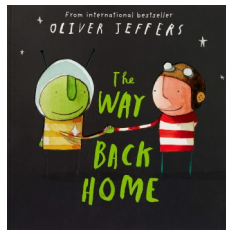
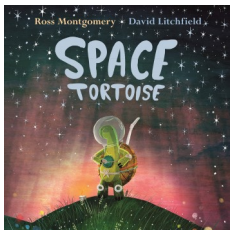
This term, our work will be focused around 'Space Tortoise' and 'The Way Back Home'.

Children will:

- undertake a range of writing opportunities including: labelling, sequencing, retelling, instructions and letter writing;
- develop accurate use of spelling year 1 common exception words, punctuation and grammar including conjunctions (and );
- develop an use correct letter formation in their writing..

During guided reading the children will;

- develop their knowledge and understanding of the reading content domains.
- discuss word meaning, retrieve and record information, summarise, predict, make inferences and make comparisons within the text.

# Mathematics

Over the course of this term children will be focusing on: fractions, length and height, weight and mass, money, time

Children will:

- ] compare time [for example, quicker, slower, earlier, later]
- measure and begin to record the following: lengths and heights
- mass/weight
- capacity and volume
- time (hours, minutes, seconds)
- recognise and know the value of different coins and notes
- sequence events in chronological order using language [for example, before and after, next, first, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon and evening]
- recognise and use language relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years
- tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

## History/ Geography

History this half term will focus on-Transport.

Children will:

- use a range of historical evidence including timelines, maps and secondary sources to gain knowledge of transport throughout time;
- Compare and contrast mode of historical and modern day transport.

Geography this half term will focus on– Northfield and Birmingham

Children will:

- explore their locality;
- Identify human and physical features of the local area.
- look at and understand how to interpret ariel view maps of Northfield and Birmingham.

## Computing

The computer this half term will follow the Purple Mash scheme.

Children will:

- Continue to look at e-safety.
- Using specific programmes to support English

Children will:

## Phonics

Children will:

- continue to build their knowledge of phase three and phase five phonemes.

Children will :

- experiment with different types of lines and shapes needed to draw a picture;
- evaluate their own and existing self-portraits;
- draw their own self portrait using the techniques taught.
