English


This term, our work will be focused around 'Five Minutes Peace' and Room on The Broom.

Children will:

- undertake a range of writing opportunities including: labelling, sequencing, retelling, rhyming and poetry.
- develop accurate use of spelling year 1 common exception words, punctuation and grammar including conjunctions (and);.
- develop and use correct letter formation in their writing..

During guided reading the children will;

- develop their knowledge and understanding of the reading content domains.
- discuss word meaning, retrieve and record information, summarise, predict, make inferences and make comparisons within the text.





Year 1 Autumn 2019

Mathematics

Over the course of this term children will be focusing on number, place value, addition and subtraction multiplication and division.

Children will:

- look at the place value of numbers beyond 20.
 - order and compare numbers up to 50.
- read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals
 (=) signs
- add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers up to 20, including 0.
- solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division.

<u>Science</u>

In Science this half term, children will learn about animals—including humans;

- identify, draw and label parts of the human body;
- identify parts of the body and link them to each sense;
 - name a range of domestic and wild animals;
- categorise animals by their diet (carnivore, herbivore, omnivore).

History/ Geography

History this half term will focus on-Transport.

Children will:

- use a range of historical evidence including timelines, maps and secondary sources to gain knowledge of transport throughout time;
- Compare and contrast mode of historical and modern day transport.

Geography this half term will focus on—Our School.

.children will:

- explore their school and locality;
- gain knowledge of key features of maps;
- look at and understand how to interpret an ariel view map of their school.

Computing

The computer this half term will follow the Purple Mash scheme.

Children will:

- learn about keeping safe online
- Lear how to log on and off and save documents.



The PHSE this half term will focus on being a class team and a school citizen.

Children will:

- explore rewards and consequences
- rights and responsibilities
- being a democracy

Phonics

Children will:

- continue to build their knowledge of phase three and phase five phonemes.
- apply their knowledge in their reading and writing.





Art/DT

The Art work will focus around drawing selfportraits.

Children will:

- explore shading and different pencil grades that we can use to create an effect;
- experiment with different types of lines and shapes needed to draw a picture;
- evaluate their own and existing self-portraits;
- draw their own self portrait using the techniques taught.



Music

The music this half term will follow the Cheranga scheme.

Children will:

- identify the structure of songs
- explore styles of music— old school Hip Hop.
- analyse performances.
