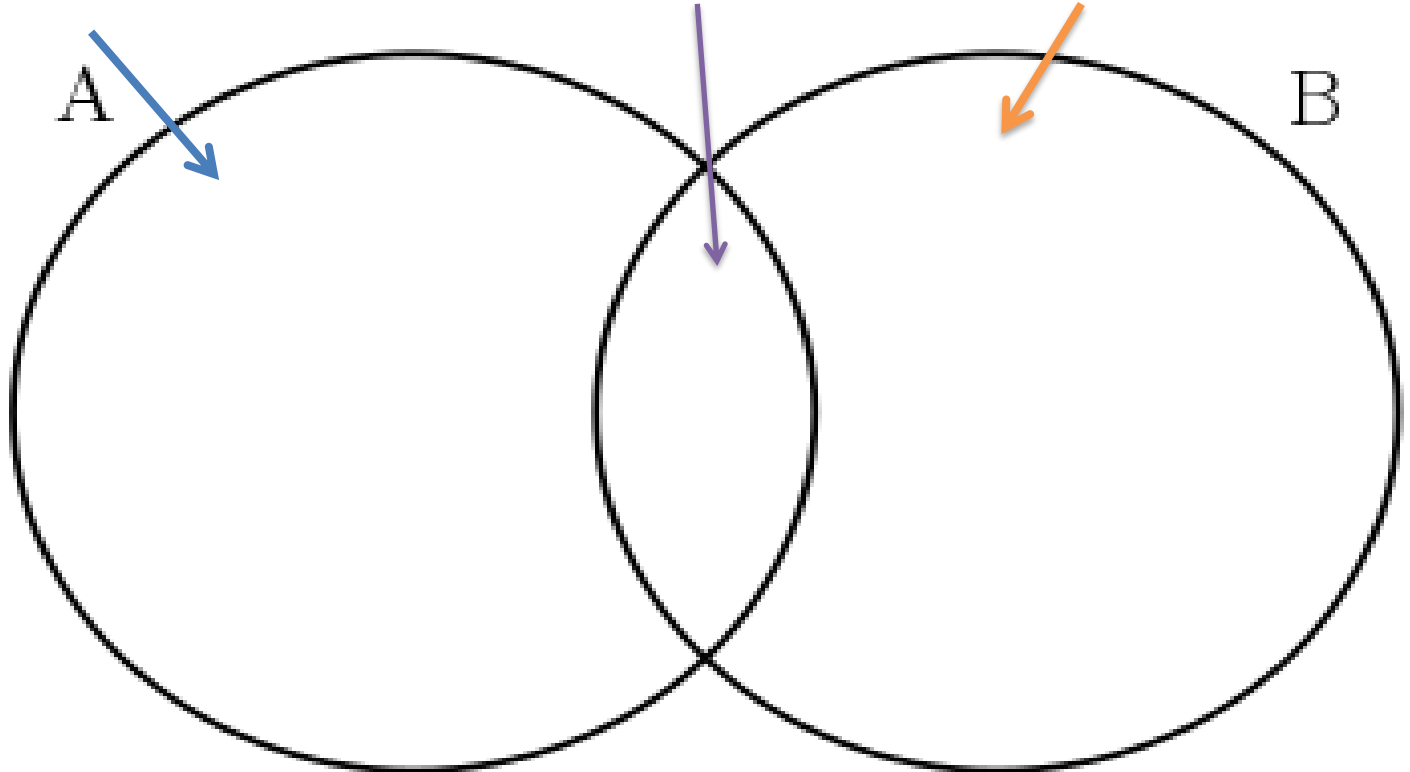


84% of public transport taken by people in birmingham is bus.

Example:

Both Berlin and Birmingham have airports. Berlin has 2 airports as well as 4 airports not in operation, whereas Birmingham has only 1 airport. However, Birmingham has more airports per square mile because it is a smaller city.
